What was the best news womxn and allies have had since Roe was overturned by the Supreme court in June? Kansas voters overwhelmingly defeated a state constitutional amendment that could have resulted in an almost complete ban on abortions in Kansas.

The amendment was resoundingly defeated with a final tally of 59% against to 41% in favor. This result is even more amazina since Kansas is a red state that supported Trump in 2016.

This wasn't luck or magic. It was the result of a months-lona effort by Kansans for Constitutional Freedom, a non-partisan coalition of voters. Their spokesperson Ashley All and staff crafted a message that appealed to voters from all corners of the state. Ads focused on real people - women, men, ministers and arandmothers - and equated the abortion bans with the elimination of individual rights and freedom. The mobilized electorate, focused on this issue, turned out in extraordinary numbers.

Ms. All is an accomplished communication and political strategist with more than 18 years' experience working primarily in red states including her home state, Kansas. She holds a master's degree in Strategic Communication from Columbia University.

Ms. All is the mother of 4 airls and has stated, "(T)his campaign was for them."

However, she is not resting on her laurels. She is already thinking about the next step - keeping people engaged for the battles ahead.

Exponential Leap in Taxpayer Money Giveaways to CPCs in 2021/2022

There has been an exponential leap in taxpayer money giveaways to anti-abortion clinics known as crisis pregnancy centers (CPCs). N&O article "NC's new state budget funds pregnancy centers that steer clients away from abortion," did not explain that in 2022, the NC state budget gave *an extra 3 million dollars* to these anti-abortion clinics. That increases the current allocation to an unbelievable \$19 million over two years. Many believe these anti-abortion clinics are harmful and state funding of them is unconstitutional

The receiving clinics are known as crisis preanancy centers (CPCs) and CPC umbrella organizations and their sole purpose is to dissuade women and airls from aetting abortions. Some describe themselves as Christian ministries. According to the American Medical Association (AMA) Journal of Ethics, CPCs Are Legal but Unethical. "They strive to give the impression that they are clinical centers, offering legitimate medical services and advice, yet they are exempt from regulatory, licensure, and credentialing oversight that apply to health care facilities." Even worse, since they are not really medical clinics, they are not bound by HIPAA privacy law. There is nothing to stop the CPC volunteers or staff from giving the pregnant person's personal information to anyone, including right wing individuals or anti-abortion organizations that may stalk or harass these women and girls.

The growth in tax giveaways to the current \$19 million has been exponential. It started with \$250,000 in 2013. The legislative leadership already had allocated \$15.8 million over 2 years in the budget passed in 2021, so the \$3.1 million addition in 2022 increased the 2 year allocation to \$19 million. The increase in 2022 was more than the total allocation in the 2 year 2017 budget. In the 2017 budget, which was the last to be signed by a governor before 2021, the allocation was \$2.6 million over two years. 2017 was a great leap from 2015, when the allocation was for \$300,000. Before 2013, NO TAXPAYER MONEY WENT TO CPCs, as it should be.

In 2019, Professor and constitutional scholar Gene Nichol wrote about how the state giving taxpayer money to CPCs violates the First Amendment. Professor Nichol also wrote that funding CPCs is government sponsored religion. It is not clear how the 2021 allocation got to be so unbelievably high because the 2022 state budget was written in secret, with no input from the public or even many legislators. It is clear that no North Carolina taxpayer money should be funding these anti-abortion centers masquerading as medical clinics.
